Course Description including style of learning	<p>The course has elements of both practical and theory work. Practical time is spent working in fully equipped Motor Vehicle workshops, where learners can build on knowledge gained during theory session and further develop their skills in repairs, servicing and diagnostic testing, as well as this learners will spend up to 25 days work related experience with local employers.</p> <p>The Level 1 young apprenticeship programme is far more demanding than the Pre-Apprenticeship scheme and aimed at learners who would be able to demonstrate and maintain a high level of commitment towards their studies.</p> <p>The programme will require learners to attend college for two days per week and will also be expected to keep up with regular school studies. On completion of the programme learners may have the opportunity to obtain employment with-in the motor industry and return to college on an Apprenticeship programme.</p>
Assessment	Learners are assessed via a number of module related phase tests and awarding body on-line assessments.
Homework	Home work is normally given in the form of research/assignment tasks.

Course Description including style of learning	<p>The course consists of both theory and practical work. Practical time is spent working in fully equipped Motor Vehicle workshops, where learners can develop their skills in repairs, servicing and diagnostic testing, as well reinforcing the theory knowledge gained during sessions. Learners will also spend up to 50 days work related experience with local employers.</p> <p>The Level 2 young apprenticeship programme is a very demanding programme and aimed at learners who will be able to demonstrate and maintain a high level of commitment towards their studies.</p> <p>The programme will require learners to attend college for two days per week and will also be expected to keep up with regular school studies. On completion of the programme learners may have the opportunity to obtain employment with-in the motor industry and return to college on an Advanced Apprenticeship programme or progress onto the level 3 full time diploma course.</p>
Assessment	Learners are assessed via a number of module related phase tests and awarding body on-line assessments.
Homework	Home work is normally given in the form of research/assignment tasks.
